ENROLLMENT OVERVIEW

- The Enrollment Overview and First-Year Profile data are as of the end of the third week of the fall term.
- These figures represent total headcount, including full- and part-time, degree- and non-degree-seeking students.
- States include US territories; countries include American military bases located abroad.

UNDERGRADUATE DETAILS

 Non-degree-seeking students are enrolled in courses but their ultimate goal is not to earn a degree from JCU.

FIRST-YEAR PROFILE

- These figures include all full- and part-time, first-time, first-year students.
- Average high school grade point average (GPA) is based only on the students who submitted their GPA.
- Top 10% represents students ranked in the top 10% of their high school graduating class, only for schools that provide rankings.
- Northeast Ohio includes students from the following counties: Ashland, Ashtabula, Columbiana, Cuyahoga, Geauga, Lake, Lorain, Mahoning, Medina, Portage, Stark, Summit, Trumbull, and Wayne.

OUTCOMES

- Retention and graduation rate figures are based on first-time, full-time entering cohorts.
- Retention reflects the percentage entering in fall 2017 who returned to JCU in fall 2018.
- Graduation rates reflect the percentage entering in fall 2012 who graduated by summer 2016 (4 year) and by summer 2018 (6 year).

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) STUDENTS

Student FTE is the number of undergraduate credit hours divided by 15, plus the total number of graduate and post-baccalaureate credit hours divided by 9.

Student FTE figures are as of the end of the third week
 of the fall term.

FACULTY

- Faculty FTE represents the number of full-time faculty in the classroom plus the total course credit hours taught by all other instructors, divided by 12.
- Faculty FTE figures are as of September 2018.
- Student-to-faculty ratio is calculated by dividing total Student FTE by Faculty FTE.
- Courses excluded from the average undergraduate class size calculation include online, non-credit, internships, practicums, individualized experiences, and graduate-level courses.

DEGREES AWARDED • These figures represent all degrees awarded between July 1, 2017, and June 30, 2018.
