Type of Incident(s): Catalytic Converter Theft

Date/Time of Incident(s): Friday 3/17/23 8:30-11am

Incident Description: A student reported parking her silver Honda Element in the Dolan East Lot at approximately 8:30 am. When she returned to her vehicle at approximately 11 am and attempted to drive away it was discovered the catalytic converter had been removed from the vehicle.

Description of Suspect(s): Possible vehicle driven by the suspect is a white Jeep Grand Cherokee with a sunroof.

Additional Information: Catalytic converter thefts have been on the rise both locally and nationally. If you observe suspicious activity in university parking lots, especially people who appear to be working underneath a parked vehicle, please contact JCUPD as soon as possible.

Ø Let a responsible person know where you are going, when you will return and how to contact you if you go somewhere alone outside of your normal routine.

Ø Use the "buddy" system with people you trust to watch out for each other's safety if you go to a party, bar or nightclub.
